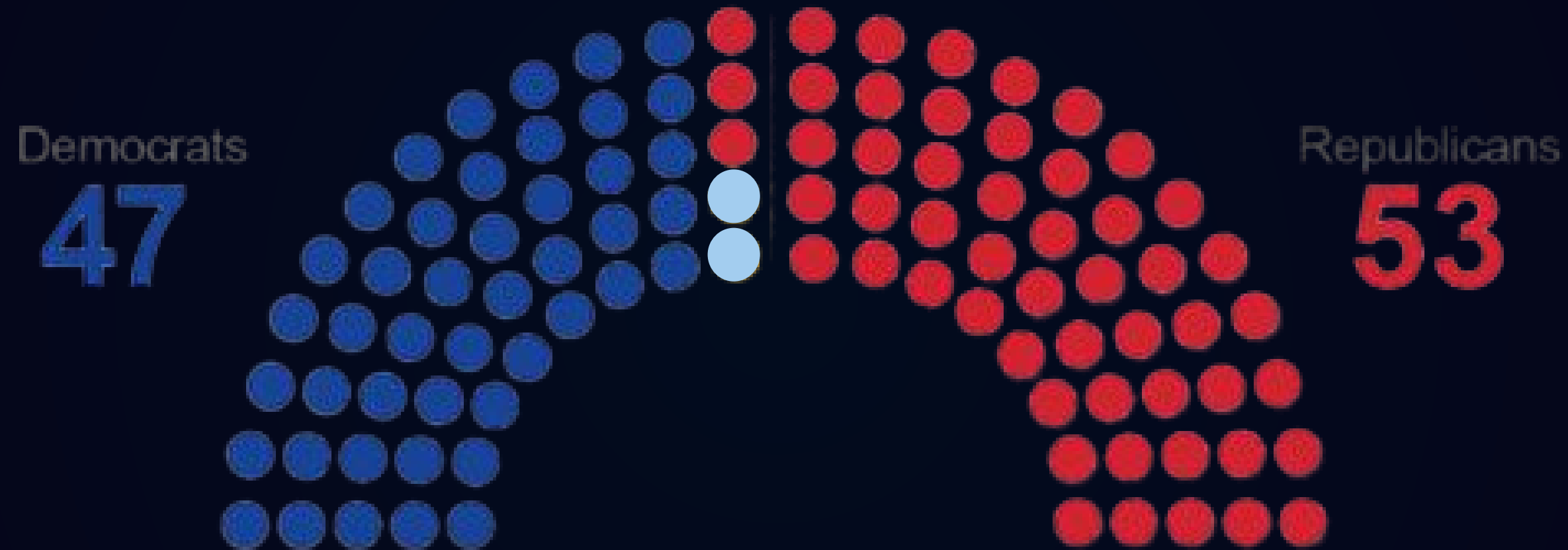

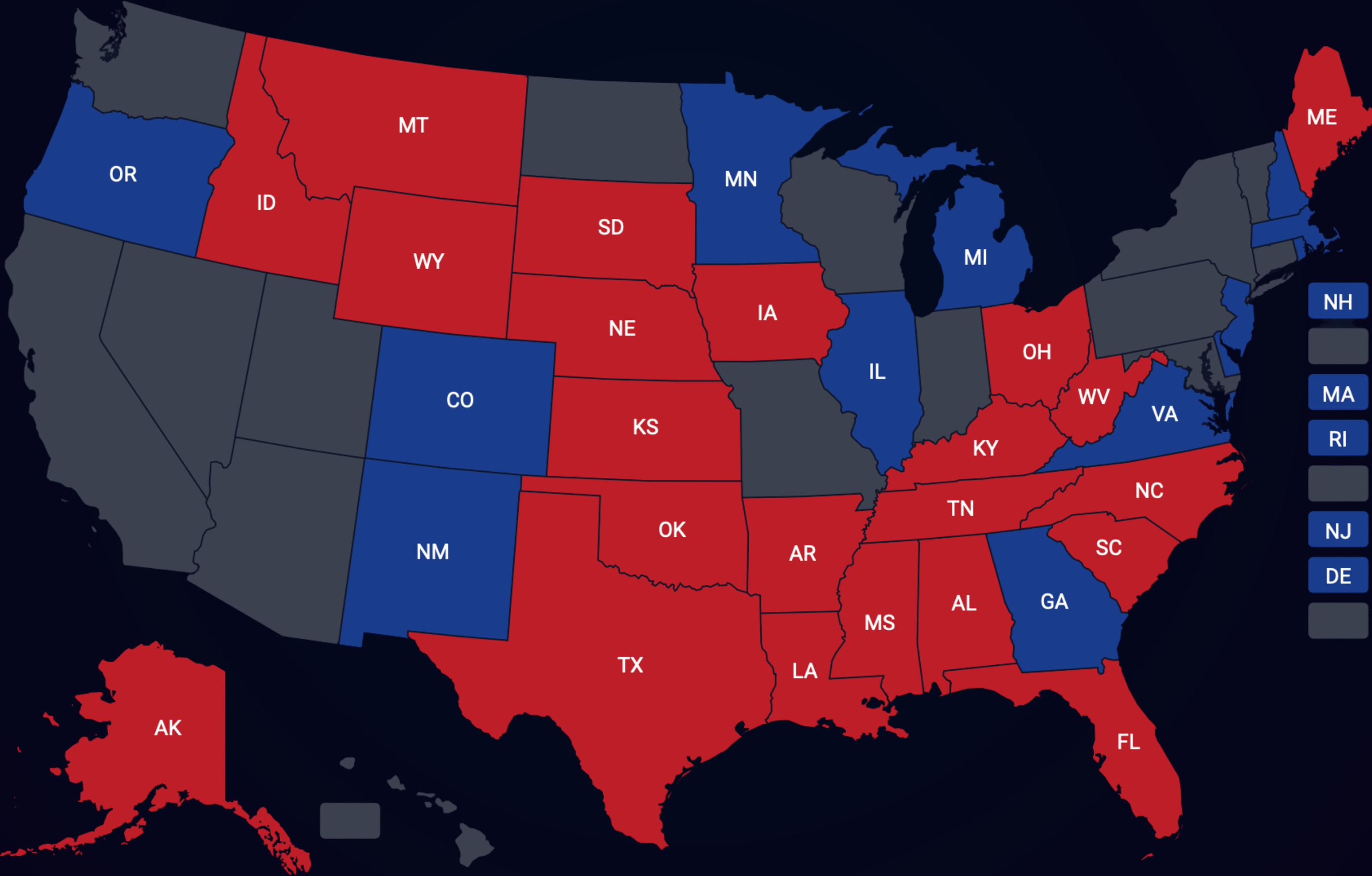

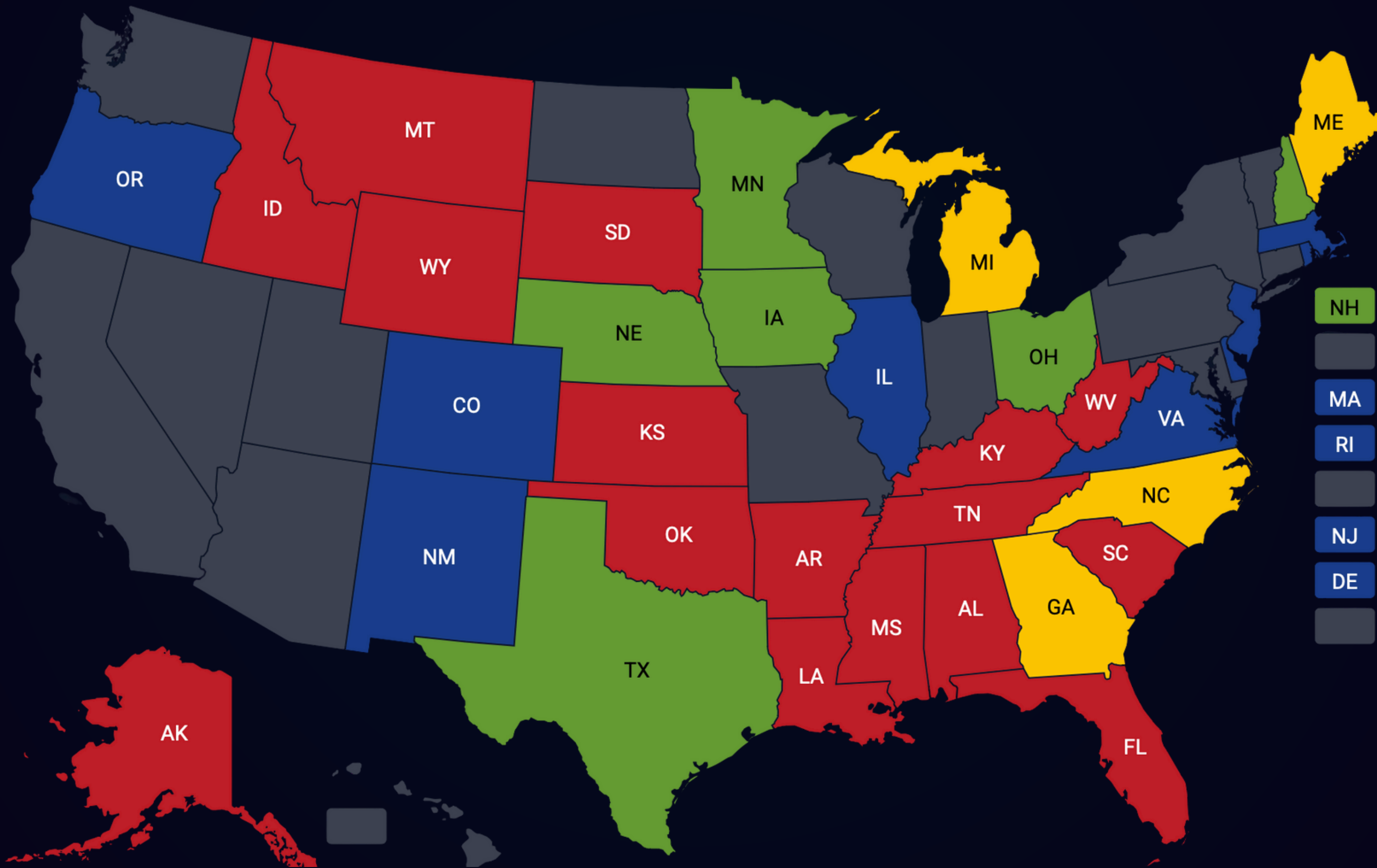


**Democrats need to defend 13 seats and flip 4 more in order to win the Senate**

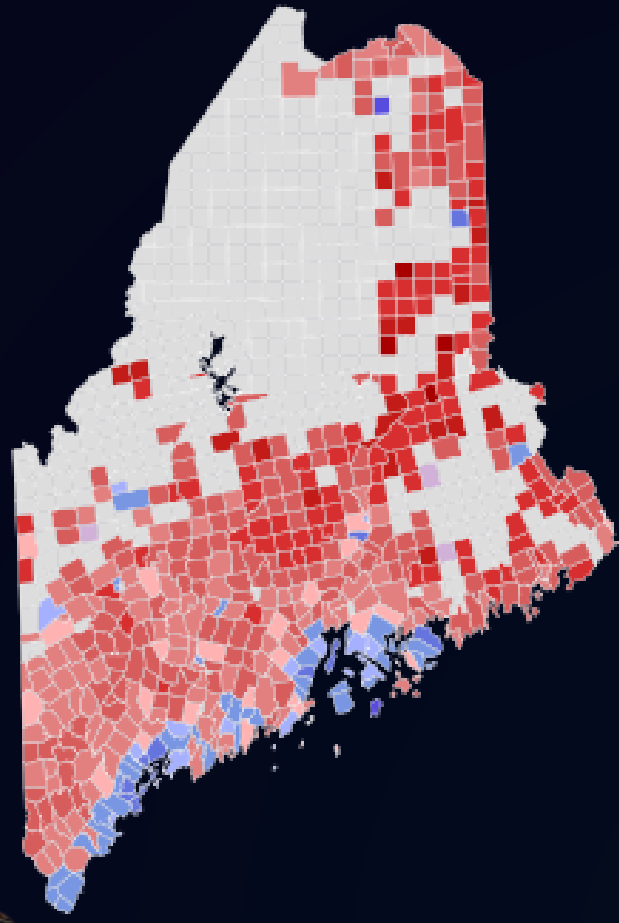

- Rural Healthcare

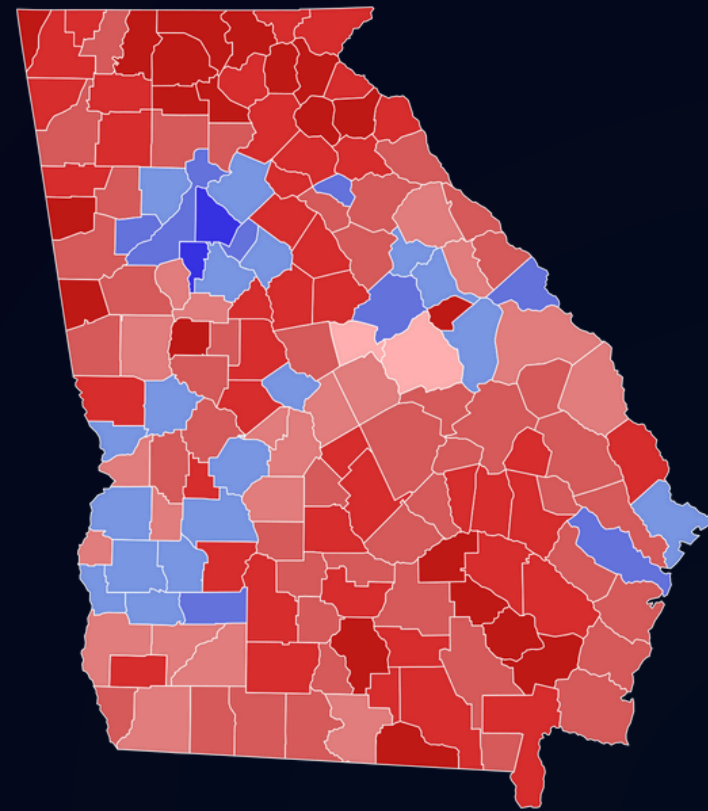
Problems for Collins:

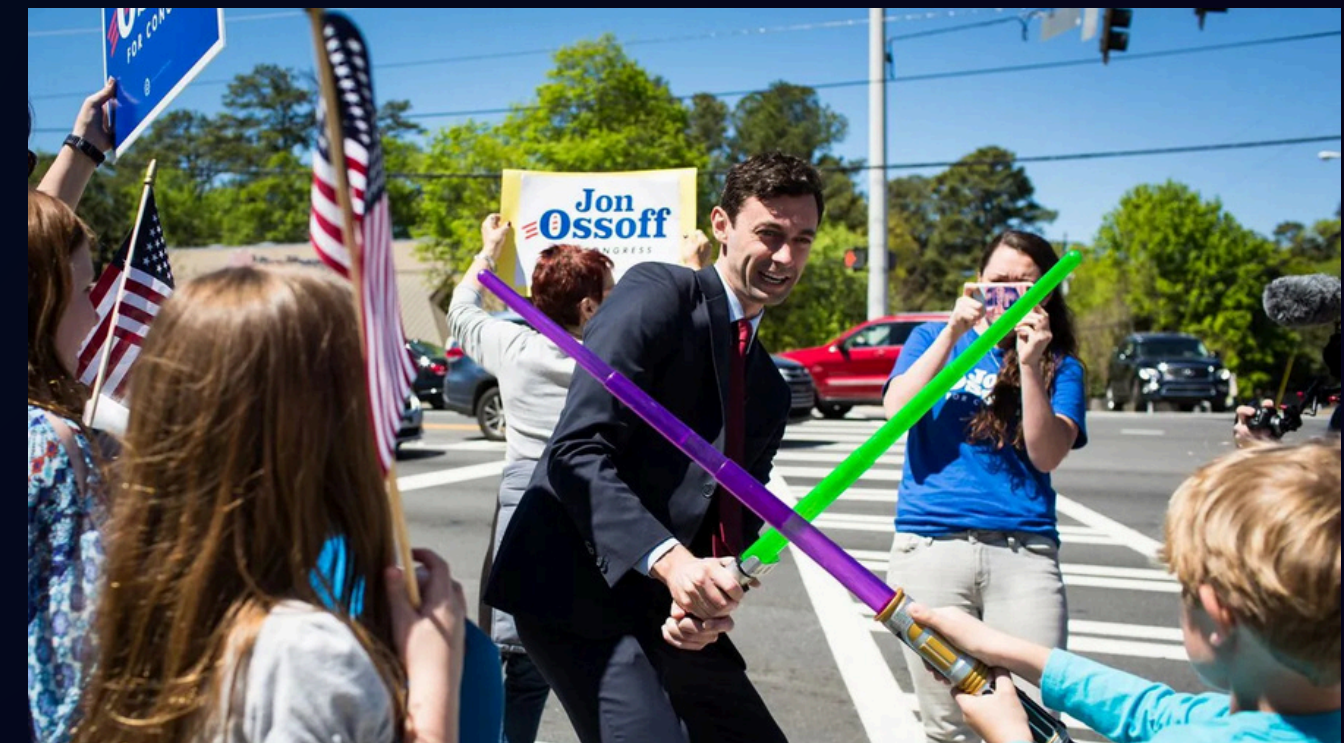

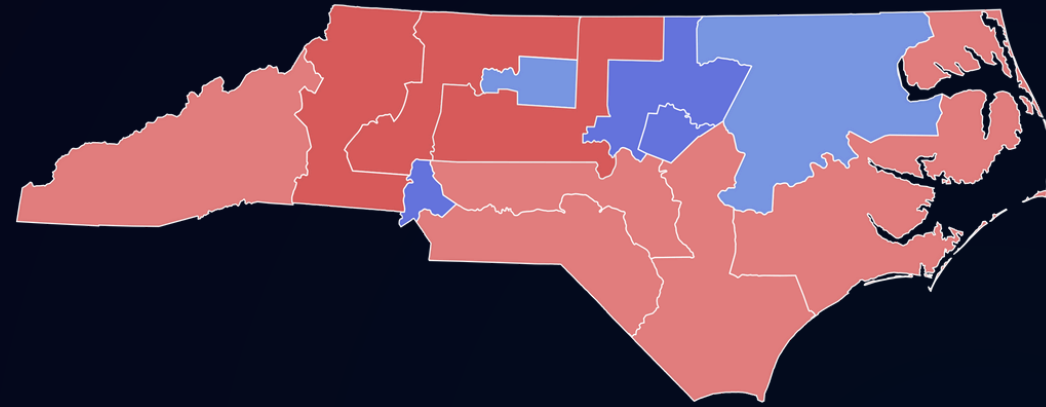

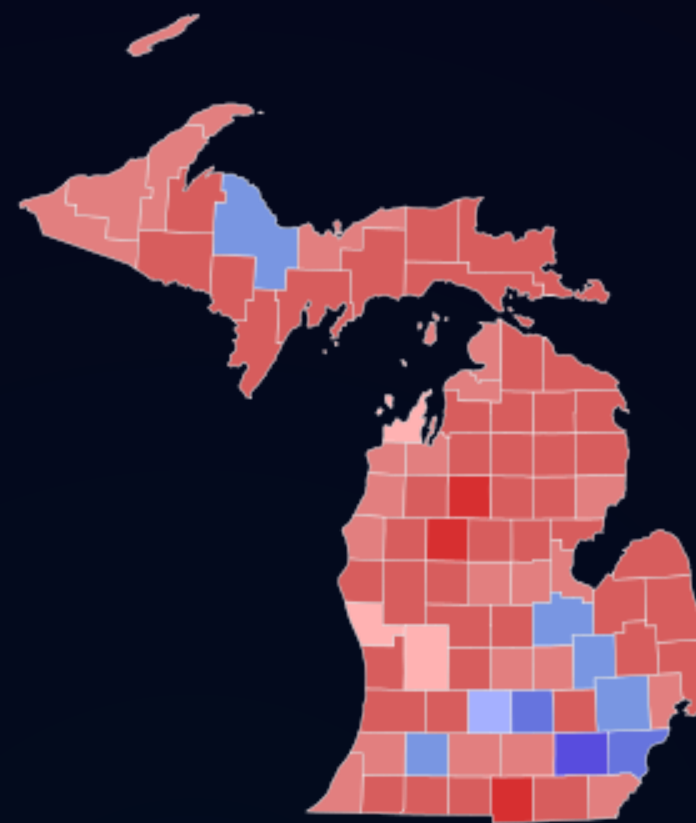
